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Best Practice No. 1

- **1. Title of the Practice:** Computerization of the College Library.
- **2**. **Goal:** The goal of this practice is
 - To start an integrated library system with all of its merits.
 - To ensure a better cataloguing, classifying and indexing the library books.
 - To provide a Public interface of the library for its users.
 - To provide ease of access.

With a view to these missions, we have incorporated our own Library Management System, by installing SOUL 2.0 from http://www.inflibnet.ac.in/soul/.

- 3. The context: The College has a library that is well stacked, but there is a serious lack of library staff to serve all the students and faculties for helping in searching, obtaining and issuing books. The ILS can be the best solution of this adversity. At the same time, it cannot be denied that in the modern era when there is plenty availability of a nice technology like ILS, it will not be fair and wise to overlook this facility and to deprive our students, faculties and other stakeholders visiting the library from today's facilities. So keeping these things in mind, we opted for this project.
- **4. The Practice:** The library is running the ILS software, Soul 2.0. There is a high-end desktop PC operating as the server, and two other client computers are also there for ensuring ease of access. The server is on the Librarian's desk and managed and operated by himself. One server is in the stack room and the other is in the teacher's reading lounge.

The implementation of the ILS has made it easy to search the stacks, easy to find the required book and easy control over book lending, which definitely enhances the quality of the teaching-learning process.

- **5**. **Evidence of success:** We can say that the measure is a successful one. Some points may be placed as the evidence of success as:
 - It has increased the daily number of walk-ins and lending-returning the books.
 - Though it is difficult to enumerate the extent, but there is no doubt that the accuracy of cataloguing and indexing have dramatically increased after implementing SOUL 2.0.
 - The extent of control over the lend-out books has been increased, which reflects in the book returning and token fine charging pattern.
- **6. Problems encountered and Resources Required:** The great measure still have some problems, limitations and shortcomings. Here is a brief account:
 - Due to some space constraints, we haven't yet been able to provide the SOUL OPAC for students' access. There is no computer in students reading lounge, unfortunately. The Library Advisory committee is thinking on how this issue could be resolved.
 - There is a shortage in the number of library staff.

We positively hope that we will be able to overcome these limitations, and the library of this college will continue to be the proud of the institution, as it always was.

Best Practice No. 2

- 1. Title of the Practice: Introduction of Physical Education.
- 2. Goal: The goal of this practice is
 - To promote extra-curricular activities in the field of Sports of Games,
 - To ensure the physical and mental development of the students, and
 - To open some more career opportunity in front of them.

A fit body is the right container of a sharp brain, and so Physical Education is the best complementary activity of general education.

- 3. The context: The College always encourages sports and games. We always have students excellent in various sports like Cricket, Football and Athletics. But due to the absence of a formal body, there was a lack of participant students in various meets of different levels over last few years. It was tough to form the sports team of the college team, too. Moreover, we did not have a permanent playground. The opening of this department is supposed to minimize those issues.
- 4. The Practice: We are grateful to the Krishnagar Municipality for letting us use the playground in front of the college "Mallick Math" as our own playground. As we have a playground now, the university has permitted us to introduce the aforesaid department. A teacher (guest) is employed for this purpose, and the department started its activities with a total of 38 students. A sizeable number of students have applied for that subject, but as the intake capacity is limited, we could not take all of them. Despite of that fact, all the willing students participate in football, cricket and athletics practice, take part in the parade, etc. The teacher of this department manages the different sports teams, trains them for various meets and tournaments over and above the regular activities of the curriculum.
- **5**. **Evidence of success:** We can say that the course is a successful one. Some points may be placed as the evidence of success as:
 - There is a rush of applicants. A sizable number of applications were received. But as we have a limited intake capacity of 38 students only, we had to refuge a lot of the applicants, with a great regret.
 - The number of participants in various sports meets from our college has increased.
 - The students of the department have own awards in sports like football, athletics and badminton.
- **6. Problems encountered and Resources Required:** As a newly born facility, this course has some problems like:
 - We don't have a playground that is completely owned by us.
 - The department does not have any full time teacher. There is only one guest teacher conducting a lot of jobs associated with proper running and maintenance of the department.
 - Equipment is still inadequate for the practice for all the students of the department itself, and for other willing participants in sports and games.

We positively hope that we will be able to overcome these issues in the near future and our Department of Physical Education will become a truly excellent unit very soon.
